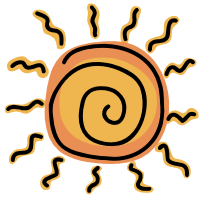

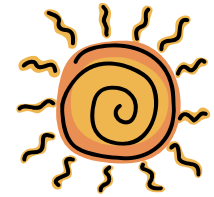

MARKET UPDATE

Beef, Poultry & Dairy

Dairy- Cheese: The cheese market is weak and prices tumbled on the CME Group cash cheese market this week, breaking below the \$2.00 per pound mark for the first time since early June. Blocks closed on Friday at \$1.9000, -0.1250 from last Friday and barrels at \$1.8625, -0.2175. Some buyers are anticipating loading up for fall needs at these lower prices but they may find that plants may be unable to fill orders due to lack of milk. There continues to be cheese available in parts of the West though more limited offerings through most of the rest of the country. The reopening of schools is also a growing factor in the next few weeks, pulling more milk from manufacturing. Cheese production is steady to generally lower seasonally. **Butter-**Churning activity is mixed across the country. Plant maintenance at various facilities and lower milk and cream intakes at other operations in the East are limiting butter output, while elsewhere in the country, cream volumes are increasing and butter production is enhanced. Cream pricing multiples are trending lower. Students are returning to the classroom across the country and this activity will continue for the next 3 -4 weeks, thus the call for fluid milk to refill bottling pipelines will be strong. Butter demand is holding seasonally steady. Retail orders are being enhanced by scattered feature activity with food service orders steady to lighter. The summer vacation season is winding down, thus orders from resort and vacation areas of the country are reflecting end of summer patterns.

Beef-The drought in the Southwest has forced cattle producers to send their herd to feedlots earlier than scheduled. This is bullish beef production this fall, but bearish beef production in 2012. Beef steak cuts continue to be supported by Labor Day holiday demand, but we look for seasonal price weakness next month. Solid exports are likely to continue to support the beef end cut markets.

Poultry- The broiler type chick hatch in the month of July was down 4% compared to July '10. Plus, pullet placements, which measure new hens added to the breeding flock, were down 3% in July versus July '10. This could be a sign that producers are making a more systemic cut in future production. But, the existing breeding flock is still well above last year's level. Elevated feed costs remain a challenge for chicken producers which could limit chicken output next year. Seasonal demand for breasts usually fade in September but demand for wings typically stays strong through the fall. Higher chicken wing prices are anticipated during the next few months.

Fresh Produce

Bell Peppers-Eastern Bells: Pepper now available in good supply in Michigan, and the markets continue to drop. Quality is good and demand has been steady. Medium pepper still is an issue, with mostly large and XL being shipped.

Strawberries- Market continues to strengthen with good demand from the Labor Day pull starting the middle of this week. Look for the market to be strong for the next week and half. Slight warming trend is forecasted for the next couple of days then it is suppose to cool back down going into the weekend. Quality is still fair out of all areas. Sizing of the strawberries currently is small to medium. Counts are ranging from 18 to 24. Stem strawberries are very limited and the ones that are being packed are for the most part are strawberry with a long stem.

Potatoes-The Idaho carton market is down to New Crop only. Prices are steady but firm on the larger counts with very limited supplies on 70ct and larger and slightly lower on the smaller sizes 80ct and smaller. New-crop Washington Norkotahs are still peaking on 80/90 count but some lots have larger size. Colorado is done with old crop norkotahs. Kansas & Nebraska continue packing new-crop Norkotahs. The new-crop Norkotahs are still all over the size spectrum but mostly small although some suppliers have larger counts. Stockton, California continues to pack colored potatoes of all colors and the market is steady to lower. California availability is good except in larger reds and golds. Washington & Minnesota both continue packing reds and golds but supplies are fairly limited. Both areas have good numbers of A's and B's while premiums remain limited.

Seafood

Salmon-East Coast: Farms are continuing to produce a steady supply of fish from the active farms. A few smaller farms in Canada have limited supply of harvested sizes and much of the stock needs to grow out. The larger farms should have adequate supply through the season and prices have remained steady through the summer.

West Coast-The Harvest in most areas has been excellent this season with a few areas experiencing lower numbers. Supply for most species continues to be strong and prices are moderate.

Shellfish-Harvesting of most shell fish has been excellent and supply has been very consistent this summer. Fortunately the dreaded Red Tide outbreaks have been very minimal and the season for Red Tide is drawing to an end as fall approaches. With thunderstorms and rain expected over the next few days there could be some closures which could impact prices.

Swordfish- Landings from American and Canadian vessels have been steady although light for this time of year. Some boats are moving north looking for fish with some boats offloading in Newfoundland. With fall approaching many Captains are anticipating a better harvest as the fish school up before returning south along the Gulf Stream. There has been a steady supply of Central and South American warm water fish being offered as H&G fish or pre sliced loins as well.
