# Market Update

Category	Up/Down/Flat	News Flash
<b>Beef</b>		Beef trimming prices have been firm so far. This is due in part to seasonally expensive end cut products including chucks and rounds supporting less expensive beef trimmings. Due to an inflated Australian dollar, future beef exports from that country to the US may remain historically light. This may support lean boneless beef trimming markets in the coming months.
<b>Poultry</b>		Chicken producers continue to limit pending chicken supplies causing the chicken markets to firm. Other than a modest price decline expected for chicken wings next month, chicken prices are projected to remain strong this winter. In fact there is potential for record high wing prices this winter and \$2 boneless skinless chicken breast prices this summer.
<b>Milk</b>		The dairy markets are generally steady at the onset of 2012, with no sustained pressure to push the market either up or down. Production growth is moderate, inventories are sufficient, sales are adequate and the world market is stable.
<b>Cheese</b>		Prices for cheese at the CME Group this week traded in a narrow range. Both barrels and blocks are trending steady to weak with moderate to good activity on blocks and light sales for barrels. Demand for cheese is being fed by increased retail orders for NFL playoff parties. Processors are increasing purchases as normal operations resume after the holidays.
<b>Butter</b>		The CME cash butter price firmed early in the week to \$1.6400, but eased later in the week to settle at \$1.6125 by week's end. Churning schedules across the country are active, but lighter than during the recent year-end holiday period. Overall butter buying interest is fair at best. Orders being placed are for near term needs.
<b>Oil</b>		While soybean oil prices continue to be pressured by the external force of global economics, weather is expected to be the dominating force affecting volatility for the next couple of months. It is speculated that if the South American crop deteriorates further, prices will rise, sending China back to the US to restock its reserves. All of this plays out against the backdrop that according to the USDA, our 2.315 billion lbs. of soy oil ending stocks are the lowest in 7 years. While the USDA report was bearish, there remain many in disagreement with it and who expect prices to remain firm.
<b>Flour</b>		Ample wheat supplies have been arriving to market, keeping a check on basis premiums. It remains to be seen if the major move lower in the futures market will slow the pace. Mild winter weather has allowed wheat to move on time as well, which is welcome, but that could change quickly.
<b>Sugar</b>		The gap between world sugar consumption and production is likely to disappear in 2010/11. Therefore, in the short term there is a supply tightness but a global surplus is looming in a matter of 9 to 12 months. With such a contradiction between short-term and medium-term fundamentals the instability of world sugar prices comes as no surprise.
