Market Update

Beef, Poultry & Dairy

Dairy- The CME cheese markets continue to trade at inflated levels due to healthy seasonal holiday demand for cheese. Cheese exports in Sept were up 22% versus a year ago but were the 2nd smallest since Nov. US cheese markets are currently priced at their largest premium to US butter since Dec '09 which should encourage cheese production. CME cheese block prices have fallen in each of the last 5 Decembers with the average decline being 11%. Sept butter exports were down 38% from last year and the smallest for any month since February. The butter market is weak.

Poultry- Chicken output usually picks up in the winter, but production cut plans have been more systemic and deep this fall. The 6 week moving average for broiler type egg sets is currently trending 7.5% below the previous year. Chicken output is anticipated to trend below 2011 levels deep into next year. This should be supportive of the chicken breast, wing and other chicken markets. The chicken wing market continues to appreciate due to strong fall season demand. In fact, chicken wing prices have achieved their highest price level since December '10. The chicken breast markets likely have established their seasonal lows with breast prices recently firming. Notably higher chicken breast prices are anticipated early in 2012.

Beef- Poor beef packer margins could curb beef production for the near term. This may be bullish for several beef markets including tenderloins and ribeyes which tend to move higher in Nov in response to rising pre-holiday seasonal demand. Pasture conditions remain in awful shape in the Southern Plains and cattle production in this region may be challenged in '12. Beef prices could rise next year especially if the USDA forecast of beef output declining 4.9% is realized. Still, a rising US dollar could temper any pending beef market increases.

Fresh Produce

Asparagus- This market is steady on product from Mexico. Mexico production continues to be very light on jumbo and extra large sizing and is commanding a higher price. Supplies are predominately small and standard. The quality has been reported as being good. Peruvian product is moderate in availability.

Blackberries: Quality remains very good with supplies continuing to outpace demand. Prices will continue to reflect this for the near term.

Onions- Idaho, Oregon, & Washington are all steady to lower on yellows. Good supplies and light demand are keeping the market down. Idaho/Oregon still has more jumbos and colossal while Washington has more jumbos and mediums, and both areas will discount for volume. Colorado still has limited volume of yellows with some on the eastern side and some on the western slope but supplies remain light. The northwest yellow quality has been excellent. Reds are still plentiful in Washington and the volume deals remain. Idaho is still lighter on red supplies but they will discount a little for volume. The markets in both areas are steady on jumbos and mediums but the mediums are still short due to Mexican export. White supplies are mostly steady but some suppliers are lighter and thus higher in price. Continue to plan ahead over the next few weeks as we expect freight rates to remain very high.

Broccoli- This market is active on bunched product as well as crowns in all growing regions. Many shippers have begun the week sold out. Supplies will be light in the Salinas valley as well as Santa Maria for the entire week. Salinas and Santa Maria continue to be the two main growing regions for this commodity. Yuma will not begin production until December.

Seafood

Groundfish- Groundfish landings have been sporadic since last week and with poor weather expected, fishing conditions will remain limited. The majority of fish landed have been Cod and Pollock. Expect Cod, Pollock and some flatfish to be the bulk of landings with Haddock landings light or sporadic.

Scallops: Landings have been limited at the New Bedford scallop auction and most of the fleet came in this weekend to avoid the storm offshore. Landings will drop off as more large boats use up their days at sea and allocated trips. There will be some landings from general category day boats from Cape Cod to Maine. The Maine inshore season starts in December and ends in March, this is a limited State fishery with mostly 25 to 35 count scallops.

Salmon: EAST COAST: East coast farms are harvesting fish at a steady pace, but prices are increasing for sizes in demand. There has been a slight increase and prices will increase during the Thanksgiving and Christmas Holiday seasons. Harvesting should continue throughout the fall and winter with some disruptions due to weather.
