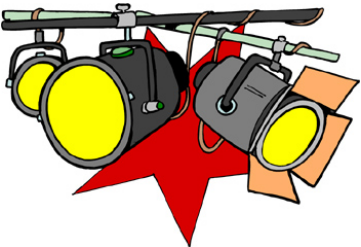

MARKET UPDATE

Beef, Poultry & Dairy

Beef-US beef exports have been firm even with the US dollar strengthening against the Brazilian Real and the Australian dollar in recent weeks. Brazil and Australia are two major beef producing countries. If this currency trend continues expect US beef exports to be challenged. This could bring some relief to beef trimmings and beef end cut prices. Rising cattle prices are pinching beef packer margins which could lead to a short term slowdown in beef output and may be supportive of beef prices.

Poultry- Chicken producer spot feed costs are at their lowest levels since December '10. However, with chicken breast prices depreciating, chicken producer margins have continued to struggle. In fact, last week's spot profitability was the lowest for the comparable week in 6 years. Deeper chicken production cutbacks are expected which should continue to support chicken prices. Plus, if chicken production reductions run deep into 2012, chicken wing prices could be especially bolstered. The last time the chicken markets experienced an annual decline in chicken production was 2009 with the result being record high chicken wing prices.

Dairy-Cheese-The CME Group cash cheese market is still trading within a narrow price range. Orders have improved for many packagers with overtime needed on more lines. Process interest is generally steady to lower though a few have had improved orders. Cheese supplies are tight on certain specialties often associated with fall such as aged hard Italian varieties as well as muenster. Mozzarella interest is also improved between cooler temperatures, schools/colleges open, and football season aiding pizza sales. Cheese production is relatively steady though improving cheese yields are helping manufacturers offset milk shipped to fluid accounts. Butter-The cash butter price declined slightly early in the week and closed the week at \$1.7600. The current cash price is \$.3325 lower than when the current weak trend began on August 30. Many butter producers and handlers feel that the current cash price might be where it will settle for the time being. Churning activity across the country is seasonally active. Most butter producers and handlers were anticipating that butter prices would have remained at higher levels than they currently are, limiting buyer interest. Now that the cash price has eased, buyers are returning to the marketplace with heavier orders. Orders are especially heavier for upcoming yearend and holiday needs. More retail buyers are now planning on running features that they previously did not anticipate.

Fresh Produce

Avocado-California harvest is winding down with only a few shippers packing a couple times a week and should be done soon. Mexico supplies are increasing and will continue to do so. We are beginning to see lighter supplies from Chile as they begin to ship a larger percentage of their fruit to the other markets of the world.

Broccoli- This market is firm on bunched product as well as crowns. Supplies are moderate but demand is light, so there are no issues with orders being filled. Salinas and Santa Maria continues to be the two main growing regions for this commodity. There are no major quality issues to report at this time.

Oranges-Valencia orange supplies on 113 and 138's continue to be demand exceeds with most shippers selling out several days in advance. Some shippers are finished or will finish Val's over the next 7 to 14 days. Valencia supplies will be limited through October. The Navel crop currently is showing signs of a slow start with indications of a short supply situation for oranges during the transition from Valencia's to Navels which will start around the first week of November.

Onions -Yellow onions continue to vary widely in price depending on the area. Most packers continue to peak on jumbos and mediums and will deal for volume orders. The demand remains fair to light in all areas and the supplies are plentiful as the harvest continues. Colorado is still light on yellow supplies. California still has a few yellows and that market is steady but the volume is limited. Reds are plentiful in Washington and the volume deals remain but the demand has picked up. Colorado & Idaho still only have mixer volume of reds. White supplies are up slightly and the market is down slightly. The yellow quality has been excellent in all areas .

Seafood

Ground Fish-Landings have dropped off dramatically with the heavy winds and swells offshore. Most of the larger trawler fleet came in before the stormy weather and with another Gale approaching those boats will remain tied to the wharves. Supply will tighten up this week for all ground fish species and should remain tight until sometime next week. Prices have moved higher on all three major auctions and landings at the auctions are expected to be very light with only a few inshore boats offloading.

CANADA: A few Canadian boats landed over the weekend with limited catch and those boats will remain in port until the approaching storm passes the Maritimes. I do not expect any volume of fish landings in Canada until sometime next week assuming the boats can get out and find the fish.

Halibut-East Coast: The weather has forced many boats into shore and landings from the Canadian Maritimes have been very limited. There have been some limited quantities of fish available from the small day boat fleet. Prices are extremely high and will remain strong until the large offshore boats return to fishing.

West Coast: With less than two weeks left to this Halibut season, landings remain very light and prices are very high. Most boats have finished catching their quota early and these boats will switch to other species or tie up for the year. The new season starts next spring in March and there could be an additional reduction in quota for 2013?

Tuna: Landings continue to be very light for Big Eye and Yellowfin tuna fish from American and Canadian swordfish boats. There are some Albacore being landed in Canada, but very few fish are being shipped into the USA market. Imports from Central America and Indonesia make up the bulk of imported tuna.
