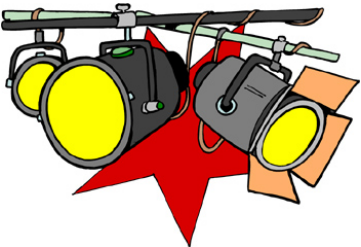

# MARKET UPDATE

## Beef, Poultry & Dairy

**Pork**-Pork output last week decreased 1.4% but was 3.1% larger than the same week in 2010. The total hog inventory on September 1st was 1% higher than last year and was up 3% since June 1st. The breeding herd inventory rose 1% from 2010 and the average pigs saved per litter was a record high this past quarter. Aforementioned statistics suggest that pork output expansion is forthcoming which could be bearish for pork prices. Strong exports are currently supporting many pork markets but the seasonal price tendencies are lower.

**Poultry**- Feed supplies are still expected to be tight in 2012 and may still challenge producer margins. Broiler-type egg set numbers continue to decline near the fastest pace in 9 years with the existing 6 week moving average 8% below 2010. Chicken production should trend below prior year levels into 2012. The chicken breast markets have steadied in recent days suggesting any pending downside price risk may be nominal. Chicken wing markets remain firm but may temporarily soften soon following a seasonal trend. Yet, higher chicken wing prices are anticipated later this fall as demand picks up for the holidays.

**Dairy**- US butter production in August was up 31% from last year marking year to date output 16% ahead of 2010. Better US supplies, improving world stocks and a rising US dollar are all bearish for US butter prices. Modest butter price declines may be pending. Global cheese and butter prices are now at a premiums to domestic markets which wasn't the case this summer. This usually encourages US dairy exports. Still, the US dollar value is trending higher which could mitigate future US dairy export trade. CME spot cheese blocks fell 15% last October.

## Fresh Produce

**Asparagus**-This market is firm. Supplies on jumbo grass out of Peru has picked up. Mexico production is heaviest to small and standard sizing and supplies are only moderate. Jumbo sizing are non-existent coming out of Mexico. Production is expected to be light throughout the week. Continue to place orders early.

**Strawberries**- We had another weak front move thru the Salinas/Watsonville growing areas yesterday which only drop light amounts of rain but enough to hurt the quality and harvest numbers. On a good note the Santa Maria and Oxnard growing areas did not get hit by this storm. We are still seeing the affects from the storm that moved thru all the growing areas last week. Quality issues to be aware of will include bruising, decay, pin rot, white shoulders and water damage. Look for the market to be active with limited supplies for the next couple of weeks if not longer. The next growing area to come into play will be Mainland Mexico which will start up in a light way in about two weeks. Baja Mexico production will start up right around Thanksgiving with Florida following the end of November to the start of December. Shippers are still selective on where they are going with their fruit at this time and are keeping their fruit with customers that understand the condition of the fruit. Only order what you need as fruit is not holding up like you are use to.

**Eggplant**-New eggplant is available out of Georgia, with volume starting to increase. The market is still strong, quality has been good so far, and demand is steady.

**Squash**-Baja and Santa Maria supplies are fair. Fresno supplies are good Zucchini. Mainland Mexico production is good and is now becoming the major supplier.

## Seafood

**Tilapia**-Prices are starting to firm on Tilapia. This is especially true on 5/7 and 7/9 fillets as supplies are very tight on these sizes. 3/5 fillets seem to be plentiful. There is word of a possible disease issue in the ponds in China. If this is the case we may continue to see prices move up due to long term supply concerns. Expect much stronger pricing on the 5/7 fillets and especially the 7/9 fillets.

**Salmon**- Market is firm on Chum Salmon portions. Word is now Atlantic Farmed Salmon is going to have a huge supply this year and prices are expected to drop significantly. This will weigh on all Salmon pricing.

**Shrimp Black Tiger**- Market is steady to stronger on all sizes of Black Tigers from Vietnam, and lower prices on product from India. Inventories on some sizes are hard to find and any product from Vietnam is commanding strong premiums to other country's shrimp. Some Vietnamese sizes are now becoming more available in the US.
